CALLED TO SERVE, CALLED TO LEAD

I shared with you last month that our mission and vision begin with prayer and humility. I continue to pray that our congregation will understand that God is still calling men and women with humble motives and pure hearts to lead his people. Have you been praying? Have you begun to ask yourself, "What is my leadership role as we seek to live into our vision of becoming a center of hope in our community that reflects the love of Jesus?" Have you begun to ask yourself, "What is my part of Hillside's mission to LOVE God, SERVE others, GROW in Christ, and GO live out our faith?" We all bear an individual responsibility, but many of us are called to lead others to discover their part of the mission as well. Is God calling you to lead? Will you answer?

What does answering that call look like? I can't define that entirely for you, but I can help shape how that plays out. For some of you, this involves stepping out of your comfort zone and trying something new... maybe even failing at trying something new. For others, you are already firmly planted where you are intended to live out your calling... you just need to start sharing and expressing your faith.

Discovering your calling can take years and often involves taking one step, followed by another, followed by another, etc. Here are some ways you can begin to "dip your toe into the water" without "jumping into the deep end":

BE THAT CHURCH

Throughout the country in the month of July, representatives of Annual Conferences were electing bishops who will help guide and lead the United Methodist Church in the coming years and decades. A bishop is tasked with ordering a specific conference for ministry, strengthening local churches, commissioning, ordaining and appointing pastors to serve in those local churches, and being the chief spiritual officer of the conference. Indiana's own Rev. Dr. Frank Beard, Senior Pastor at Castleton United Methodist Church, was elected Bishop and will serve one of the conferences in the North Central Jurisdiction (NCJ). At the time of this article, we do not yet know where he will serve nor do we know who the new bishop will be in the state of Indiana.

I share this with you with you not because I think you are dying to know the "business" of the UMC, but to remind you of the power of the local church in loving people and growing leaders. I do not know Bishop Beard well, but part of his story moved me to tears as I listened to his acceptance speech. In that speech he told of being a little boy playing basketball outside of a United Methodist Church when a layman by the name of George Bennett approached him and his brother. He brought them into the church for cookies and punch, then the church paid for them to go to church camp. He expressed gratitude for that church loving on him at a time when a white church loving on a little black boy was not popular. He was called from that church to preach the Gospel.

I wept as I listened to a story filled with love, hope, and promise. While my story is very different from Bishop Beard's, I thought how my own story involves many individuals who loved on me in the name of Jesus, nurtured me into the family of God, and taught me about God's love offered to me without price through Jesus Christ. Tears rolled down my face as I celebrated in my heart with him. But, all I could think was, "I want to be more like George Bennett!" The Kingdom of God must have many "George Bennetts" and many churches who are willing to take risks to love others in the name of Jesus. We, at Hillside must take the relational risks necessary to seek out those in need of God's love and we must nurture them into the faith. **Be that church, Hillside! Be that church...**

ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2016 INFO | Nancy Whyms

As Hillside's lay member representative to the 2016 Annual Conference it was my privilege to attend my first Annual Conference June 9-11 which was held at the Convention Center in Indianapolis. I didn't know what to expect but it turns out that the Annual Conference is part worship and business meeting, part education and connection building along with a large portion of inspiration and celebration. My husband, Dick Blackburn, also attended as an equalization member.

The theme for the conference was **Be Hope.** As Bishop Mike Coyner told us in the opening worship service, hope is more than wishful thinking, and there were several presentations from churches around the state sharing stories called "Hope Talks" (think TEDTalks) about how their congregations are spreading the hope of Christ. There was a presentation about Africa University, a United Methodist –related institution located in Mutare, Zimbabwe regarding educating young people who will become future leaders throughout Africa. We were given information about resources and partners available on the conference level for discipleship and leadership development of local churches.

We conducted conference business by reviewing and approving reports from a variety of ministry areas and committees and approved the conference budget for 2017 in the amount of \$13,864,261. We approved the nomination of Rev. Dr. Frank Beard as Indiana's nominee to become bishop. We received a report from members of the 2016 Indiana Delegation on the work of the General Conference which was held in May in Portland, OR.

There was a Service of Remembrance and Holy Communion for the clergy and spouses who had passed away and we celebrated retiring clergy, especially the upcoming retirement of Bishop Mike Coyner. Bishop Mike was "roasted" as many friends and colleagues told stories. An important legacy of Bishop Mike is the Building Discipleship Centers initiative to provide special places where people can retreat and focus on hearing God. This involves building a new learning and worship space at Epworth Forest Conference Center, a new lodge at Epworth, and restoring the lake at Camp Indicoso. We presented a donation on behalf of Hillside at Bishop Mike's celebration towards Camp Indicoso.

There were vendors and displays so I picked up pamphlets and bought books. Lunch and learns and dinner meetings provided interesting ideas for youth programs. The Annual Conference was a busy few days that reminded me that here in Indiana we are a collective ministry of 1,120 churches all pursuing the shared mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

- Volunteer on Wednesday nights to help set-up tables and chairs or help prepare, serve and clean-up a meal to over 125 people as we build community. See Jeannie Robbins.
- Volunteer to read scripture at the first service, second service, or both. See Brenda Witt.
- Volunteer to help teach children's Sunday School or help out with our kids' programs on Wednesday evenings. See Amanda Miskell.
- Volunteer to be a positive adult presence on Sunday evenings with our youth by serving a meal, playing games, or assisting with small groups. See Justin Dyehouse.
- Volunteer to do "work" around the church: tree-trimming, landscaping, cleaning windows, mowing, set-up chairs for worship, etc. See Brenda Witt who will connect you with trustees.
- Volunteer to teach a short-term Bible study or topical study on a book or subject that is of interest to you. See Susan Carey.
- Volunteer to coach a kids' sports team, read in a kindergarten or preschool classroom, serve as an assistant in an elementary classroom, etc. See the head of the organization.
- Begin to listen to your co-workers' doubts, fears, hurts and anger.
 Pray for them and keep listening. Rather than "one-up" them with
 your complaints or try to "fix" them with your solutions, simply
 support them as they struggle in life. At some point they will ask
 "why?"

All of the above involve you actually taking a risk and asking, "how can I serve" and "who can I serve?" All of the above will require an investment of time, energy and emotion. You must take a first step before God will lead you to take another. Where are you called to serve? Where are you called to lead? I guarantee if your motive is the love of Christ, then your faith will grow in the process. You will be blessed as you are a blessing.

LET'S KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE

One of Jesus' most radical acts was welcoming children in teaching and worship. One of the ways in which we reflect Christ's love is by ensuring a safe place for children to learn and worship. As we move into the new school year and welcome more and more children through our doors, let's be mindful of the procedures we have in place to protect our kids:

- All adult volunteers who work with children and/or youth must have a current criminal background check on file in the office. Please see Brenda if you need to complete this process.
- Parents must sign-in and sign-out their children from nursery care, Sunday School and Wednesday night activities. Older siblings are not allowed to pick children up; parents or guardians only please.
- Our Safe Sanctuaries policy requires that two adults be present at all times when caring for children. An adult volunteer should never be alone with a child or youth.
- Parents are **responsible** for their children until the child is signed in to the care of a Sunday or Wednesday program. We love that our kids feel at home at Hillside; however, certain areas of the church are not safe for exploration.
- During the last song at Sunday Service, parents must pick up their children from **Children's Church** at the back of the worship center. This way we can be sure that each child is with his/her parent or guardian.

Thank you for understanding that these measures are necessary for protecting children and also for creating the best worship and learning environment for all of our attendees.
