The **BETTY SMITH SCHOLARSHIP FUND** was established in June of 1992 to honor Betty Smith's long-time service as choir director. The purpose of the Betty Smith Scholarship fund is to promote higher education by offering financial assistance to graduating high school seniors.

APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as an applicant for the Betty Smith/Hillside United Methodist Church Scholarship, one must

- 1. be an active member of Hillside United Methodist Church for one year prior to graduation. Active participation is defined as being involved on a **regular** basis in at least one of the following activities:
 - · Sunday morning worship
 - Sunday School class
 - · Youth fellowship
 - A civic group sponsored by Hillside (i.e. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts)
 - Other (If you believe there is another area that would qualify your involvement other than the above mentioned, please list it.)
- 2. plan to continue his/her education after high school at either a 4-year or 2-year university/college or at a vocational school.
- 3. strive to exemplify a Christian life that reflects a Christ-like lifestyle at school, home, work, and at one's future institution of higher learning.
- 4. Write an essay in answer to the following: Share your involvement with Hillside United Methodist Church. Are there particular experiences or special memories that you would like to share? Your essay should follow all formal conventions for writing: content, organization, and mechanics will all be considered in evaluating the essay.
- 5. Put your essay and application in a sealed envelope and drop it off in the Hillside Church office by **April 18, 2017.** Please indicate "Scholarship Committee" on the outside of the envelope.

HOW'S YOUR WALK? Pastor Chris Neikirk

We've been exploring the theme of *Just Walk* during Lent. This picture is a metaphor for living your life daily in close proximity and close communication with God. I asked each of us to consider our walk with God and ask some challenging questions:

- At this point in your life, are you closer to God or are you farther from God?
- If there is distance between you and God, what changed? Who moved?
- Are there habits, or even people, that you need to give up in order repair your relationship with God?
- Are there influences in your past that seem to dictate your present or your future?
- If you find yourself struggling to walk with God, who are you actually following?
- Do you believe in the power of God through Jesus Christ to transform your life so that you are walking closely with the Lord?

During this time of reflection, have you been wrestling with these questions? What answers are you coming up with?

Lent is a season marked with prayer, repentance, self-denial, self-sacrifice, and giving. The purpose is to remove our focus from ourselves and place all of our attention on Jesus Christ. The purpose is to adjust our habits so that we can draw closer to God – so that we can walk closer to the Lord.


Dear Church Family,

BOOK REVIEW-The Sprit of the Disciplines: Understanding How God Changes Lives by Dallas Willard

For many, the Lenten season is a time for reflection. Church members often talk about fasting from a particular vice, devoting more time to prayer, and making an effort to attend weekly worship more consistently. In turn, they often feel in closer relationship with God and their church by Easter morning.



But what if you desired every day, every season, to have the spiritual impact of Lent? The Spirit of the Disciplines by Dallas Willard explores that very issue. Willard examines the history and common perceptions of spiritual disciplines, as well as why we are reluctant to fully engage in practices such as weekly fasting, solitude, study, worship, and submission. Pointing to Jesus as the model for our spiritual lives, Willard encourages a fresh perspective and offers practical ways to engage in the disciplines that lead to transformation.

Admittedly, I found this book to be a more scholarly read requiring thought and reflection, but with profound impact. It affirmed several practices I already engage in, provided an interesting history to spiritual disciplines, and inspired me to continue my quest towards living the life that Jesus modeled.

If you are looking for guidance towards intentional spiritual growth, this resource has answers worth considering. Thanks to the grant received from the Center for Congregations, you can check out a copy from our new resource library. See Susan Carey for more details.

In the nursery and toddler room, it is a time that we get the opportunity to be an influence in a child's life. We get to be there for parents to have an hour together and enjoy worship, not worrying if their child is uncomfortable sitting still or trying to keep them quiet. Children do not enjoy sitting still or being quiet. In worship we don't expect either for the child. We do love the sounds of children. It is the sound of life. The nursery and toddler room are safe and clean environments that are filled with wonderful volunteers ready to care for your tired and hungry baby or on-the-go toddler. Volunteers come in 30 minutes before the service starts to be prepared for the children. Volunteers devote 6 weeks at a time to establish a relationship with children and families. Volunteers on their own accord come with fun activities such as games, crafts, or special snacks for the children. We have youth volunteers that enjoy coming to share in the fun of rocking a baby and giving a baby a bottle or blowing bubbles or playing Play-Doh with toddlers. These youth volunteers have been trained through a safe sitter class. The nursery and toddler room have policies and procedures. These are not just a list of rules but guidelines to insure the safety and love for children.

As you can see this ministry is not just babysitting. The volunteers are not your normal volunteers. These volunteers are extraordinary because they give their hearts which impacts a child and family's life. I know that I don't say it enough but THANK YOU to all of the wonderful influencers in Little Lambs Ministry. Thank you for going above and beyond to make a difference!
