FIGHT FOR THE HEART

Communicate in a style that gives the relationship value.

Take me out to the ball game. Take one kid at a time to a summer ball game. (So each kid gets a little one-on-one time with you.) Share a box of cracker jacks and root root root for the home team. Don't want to spend a lot of money?. Minor League games are cheaper and tend to focus on crowd entertainment. Or go cheer on your local recreational league for free!

WIDEN THE CIRCLE

Pursue strategic relationships for your kids.

Make a house call. Leave the car at home, if you can, and take an after dinner-bike ride to visit a pastor, small group leader, or close family friend. Be intentional about investing in the influential relationships in proximity to where you live. Just make sure to plan enough time to get home before it gets dark!

CREATE A RHYTHM

Increase the quantity of quality times you spend together.

Take a road trip. All you need is a full tank of gas and an adventurous spirit. Hop in the car for a spontaneous summer road trip. Play your favorite car games and talk about fun things on the way (something funny your neighbor said, what's the crazies dream you've ever had). Getting road weary? First one to spot a place for ice cream wins a prize!

IMAGINE THE END

Focus your priorities on what matters most.

Say hello with sweets. Notice someone moving into the neighborhood this summer? Show your kids what it looks like to be a good neighbor and welcome them with a batch of brownies. Preschoolers can help make a welcome card while older kids can whip up a plate sweet treats. Bonus: Ask if you can haul away their cardboard boxes to make cardboard forts in your own backyard.

FIGHT FOR THE HEART

Communicate in a style that gives the relationship value.

Flip bottles Enjoy the warmer weather and spend one-on-one time taking a walk or going on a short drive to a local convenience store. Let your kids pick out their favorite bottled beverage. Didn't guzzle down the whole 16oz of cherry soda? Humor your kids and have some fun with probability, and show them you can bottle flip too. Surprise your kids by clueing them in that the shape of a Deer Park water bottle makes it the best brand for flipping.

Pursue strategic relationships for your kids.

DEAR FRIENDS AT HILLSIDE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, Congratulations,

The water project you funded in Mali has been completed. Because of your generous gift, 140 people of Diangani Marka Jardin F3 now have access to clean and safe drinking water. During the last 21 months, our local implementing partners obtained permits, worked with community leaders to form Water Committees and purchased hardware materials like cement, PVC piping and hand pumps. They involved ordinary men and women in the construction process, and people began to dream of change. It's so hard to convey through a letter the significance of what you've done. This gift will bring life, health, hope and dignity to people you've never met. Since starting charity: water, I've had the honor of meeting those we're helping in the field while traveling to hundreds of our completed projects around the world. The power behind our mission is in the stories. They're real accounts of how clean water changes everything. Each and every story has its place in my memory, and I would love for you to hear one: In Mali, a woman named Umu used to wake up at 5:00 am each day and stand in line to collect water from an 800-year-old open well three hours outside her community. But all of that changed thanks to generous supporters like you. Umu's village received solar-powered pumps, a water tower, and taps that now bring clean water to families right outside their homes. Today, instead of spending her time collecting water, Umu has more time to focus on her hair braiding business and earning an income to help provide for her family. For many people, your gift was an answer to years -- sometimes decades -- of prayer. For others, it was a sudden realized and unexplained hope in a forgotten place where dreams of a better future had died long ago. Your commitment to improving the lives of these people has set up a promising future for the entire Diangani Marka Jardin F3 community. This is an amazing thing, and I'm so truly grateful.

GOD SEES YOU, GOD SENT YOU

Hillside, you have blown me away. I never imagined the movement that would begin when I shared Trina's story in my April 30th message. Many of you accepted the challenge to ask those who serve you, "Is there anything I can pray for you?" and I have so enjoyed hearing the responses and stories you have to share.

If you accepted the challenge, I anticipate you are learning the same things that I am. I am learning that all people carry hidden burdens and need someone to help carry the load, even a stranger. I am learning that people in our community feel both great joy for their blessings and great pain for their sufferings. I'm learning that one simple question creates a relationship with people in the community that I would otherwise never know. There is so much value in each of those lessons.

Do my prayers change their immediate situation? No. But maybe, just maybe, they bring hope to that person even for a moment. And when I have the opportunity to follow up, it sends the message that I see the person serving me and I care about who they are and what's happening in their life.

It takes courage to ask a stranger how you can pray for them, and I'll admit that there are days I intentionally choose the self-checkout at Walmart because my emotional reserves are depleted for the day. But I believe in the mission of this church – to Love God, to Serve Others, to Grow in Christ, and to Go Live Out Our Faith – and praying for the true needs in our community is part of fulfilling that mission. If we don't know the people in our community, how can we pray for them in a way that matters?

If you accepted the challenge, kudos to you. Keep asking that single, simple question and then let your heart sing for the praises and bleed for the needs around us. If you've not accepted the challenge, that's ok, too. I hope you'll at least remember what we learned from our encounter with Trina...God sees you, and God sent you. How will you honor that?
