ALL FOOD MUST BE MARKED WITH PREPARED DATE AND USE BY DATE IF IT'S NOT IN ITS ORIGINAL PACKAGE. THIS INCLUDES REFRIGERATOR AND FREEZER. ALL MUST BE LABELED WITH GROUP'S NAME. Food not labeled can/will be used by others.

EGGS MUST BE PLACED ON THE FLOOR OF REFRIGERATOR. Food in the pantry area should also be labeled and dated if not in its original package. Please keep expired food off shelves.

For you convenience there are labels & markers available for use on the refrigerator door.

APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as an applicant for the Betty Smith/Hillside United Methodist Church Scholarship, one must

- be an active member of Hillside United Methodist Church for one year prior to graduation. Active participation is defined as being involved on a <u>regular</u> basis in at least one of the following activities:
 - · Sunday morning worship
 - Sunday School class
 - Youth fellowship
 - A civic group sponsored by Hillside (i.e. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts)
 - Other (If you believe there is another area that would qualify your involvement other than the above mentioned, please list it.)
- plan to continue his/her education after high school at either a 4-year or 2-year university/college or at a vocational school.
- 3. strive to exemplify a Christian life that reflects a Christ-like lifestyle at school, home, work, and at one's future institution of higher learning.
- 4. Write an essay in answer to the following: Share your involvement with Hillside United Methodist Church. Are there particular experiences or special memories that you would like to share? Your essay should follow all formal conventions for writing: content, organization, and mechanics will all be considered in evaluating the essay.
- Put your essay and application in a sealed envelope and drop it off in the Hillside Church office by <u>April 15, 2016.</u> Please indicate "Scholarship Committee" on the outside of the envelope.

LITTLE LAMBS MINISTRY | Jenny White

Hillside Little Lambs Ministry is about growth, expecting the unexpected, and transitions. Transition is the pause between phases which always comes with unexpected moments. Growth, transition, and the unexpected can be exciting but also intimidating.

In the nursery there are babies progressing to being separated from parents during worship service and getting to know some new familiar faces. For some families, this requires no change at all and for others this takes time. We have welcomed new families and celebrated baptisms. We have had visitors that have come once and felt so loved that they joined the church family. One baby has developed and moved into the toddler room. One toddler has leaped ahead and is now ready for worship in children's church. From week to week, it is uncertain if the nursery will have four exploring babies or one baby that is just ready to be rocked to sleep. In the toddler room, there is the unexpected of whether this Sunday will be a day filled with six busy toddlers singing and dancing or if the room will be quiet with one toddler ready for story-time. The nursery and toddler teams are ready for the unexpected and the transitions when they come through the doors. For our families and little ones, we are here to partner with you in those moments and to be a small part of God's bigger plan of the foundation that you are preparing for your little one. NOTE FROM PASTOR CHRIS NEIKIRK

I hope that you are enjoying your Lenten journey beyond the cross to embrace resurrection to life. As I reflect and evaluate the first few weeks in our Lenten season, I feel the need to clarify my purpose for this title and this line of thinking. In no way do I want to diminish the power of the cross. The cross is a long-standing symbol of our Christian faith. The cross represents sacrifice – Jesus Christ was the willing sacrifice and willingly endured the pain of the cross for you and me. The only way that we can understand the value of eternal life offered to us through the resurrection is to grasp the magnitude of the sacrifice of the cross.

The cross was an instrument of death utilized by the Roman government designed to strike terror in the hearts of those under Roman rule. It was a long, shameful, painful, and public death for those sentenced to die in this cruel fashion. Do not minimize the magnitude of the sacrifice made by Jesus Christ and do not discount its place in our faith story. We must accept that Jesus bore the pain of our sins as he hung on that tree. Jesus Christ was the blameless Son of God. Jesus Christ was and is God himself. Therefore, because of this hard-to-comprehend truth, we believe that our God sacrificed himself for us.

In the Protestant Church, we display an empty cross and we often wear empty crosses on our person as a symbol of our appreciation of this divine sacrifice. The empty cross signifies that Jesus Christ was the ultimate sacrifice and never again would we have to pay the price for our own sins. This is the power of the cross and it is empty because it was a one-time event – Jesus is not still paying for our sins and he is no longer there. The sacrifice has been made and it is done! The cross could not conquer him.

Not only do we believe in an empty cross, but we also believe in an empty tomb. The grave could not contain him. Dying Christ destroyed our death and rising Christ restored our life. My invitation to Hillside this Lenten season is to take the journey to the cross, but do not stop there. We must move beyond the cross and beyond the tomb to claim the power of the resurrection. He lives! Our savior lives! And because Jesus Christ is alive, we too are gifted with life – not just an eternal life with God in heaven, but an abundant life with Jesus Christ now. Beyond the cross is resurrection to life! Believe and receive this new life now!
