**Easter Musical:** We have a new Easter musical this year entitled *This Changes Everything.* It is the Easter story told through the eyes of the disciples and other followers of Christ—what their expectations had been and how the crucifixion of Jesus "changes everything." The Junior Choir will be joining with the adults on portions of the musical. Both choirs will also join in singing "Palm Sunday Hosannas" on that day. The musical will be presented at the 8:30 service on Palm Sunday, April 9. Please plan to come and invite others to attend with you to hear this important message in song!

**Looking Ahead:** The Junior Choir will be singing in March as well as on Palm Sunday with the Adult Choir and again on Mother's Day in May. The kids have been working hard to learn their songs and hope that you will enjoy hearing them sing. As they did last year, the mothers of the Junior Choir kids will sing with their children on Mother's Day.

The Adult Choir's "summer season" will begin on April 30 this year. The "summer season" will be filled with a variety of music: we are hoping for a men's choir and a women's choir to sing occasionally during the summer, for the junior choir to participate at least once or twice, and for several members of both choirs to share their talents with us as soloists. You won't want to miss a single Sunday this summer!

The Adult Choir will return for its "fall/winter season" in late August and will take a short break in late December/early January before beginning the "spring season." As you can tell, this is a little different approach from what we have taken in the past, but one that we hope will be a positive experience for everyone. During the fall/winter season the choir will be learning a new Christmas musical to present on December 17. And, of course, the Junior Choir will continue to be active and sing in the fall as well as being a part of the Christmas musical.

### **HILLSIDE UMC 412 YOUTH** Justin Dyehouse

The last couple of months has been the busiest we have had in 412 Youth this year. At the end of January we had Winter Retreat and youth learned about taking the Next step in their faith journey. After coming home we had the Youth Sunday service; the youth were nervous and worried that the services wouldn't go perfectly. I believe the kids did an amazing job.

Then here came February and it was the 8<sup>th</sup> annual Valentine's Banquet, with numbers around 170 people fed and 30 youth working with 11 leaders directing the chaos. Child care this year had around 30 kids with several adults, college and youth helping. As this has become the youth's biggest fundraiser for the last several years, our guests in attendance didn't disappoint with their generosity. With over \$7,000 raised this year it will go a long way toward our goal of fully funding our June mission trip to Puerto Rico.

At the end of February we will be going to Indy Explosion for a fun-filled night of an Indiana Pacers game, followed by a Christian speaker. Then we will be going around Indy for some fun bowling, roller skating and a multipurpose game spot.

As we dig deep in our faith journey, we have looked at the beginning of Jesus' life, his early ministry and the writings of Paul. Over the next several weeks we will deliver the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, and the Resurrection.

Please continue to pray for the youth as they continue their journey to seek God and his plan for their life. Pray for the Leaders as they continue not only to grow in their faith but to help the youth with theirs.

## **JUST WALK** Pastor Chris

Coincidentally, the Lenten season begins this year with Ash Wednesday falling on March  $1^{\rm st}$ . A new month begins the journey to Easter. I am very excited about the theme for our Lenten Series this year: Just Walk. It is very simple, while at the same time, extremely deep.

We often describe a life following Jesus as a daily walk with the Lord. This picture is a metaphor for living your life daily in close proximity and close communication with God. During this journey of Lent, I invite each of us to consider our walk with God and ask some challenging questions:

- At this point in your life, are you closer to God or are you farther from God?
- If there is distance between you and God, what changed? Who moved?
- Are there habits, or even people, that you need to give up in order to repair your relationship with God?
- Are there influences in your past that seem to dictate your present or your future?
- If you find yourself struggling to walk with God, who are you actually following?
- Do you believe in the power of God through Jesus Christ to transform your life so that you are walking closely with the Lord?

Lent is a time of reflection and preparation as we move toward Easter. Lent should be a season marked with prayer, repentance, self-denial, self-sacrifice, and giving. The purpose is to remove our focus from ourselves and place all of our attention on Jesus Christ. The purpose is to adjust our habits so that we can draw closer to God – so that we can walk closer to the Lord.

I hope that you will make church attendance a priority as we take this journey together. I also hope that you will invest daily in deeper, more quality time spent talking with God and listening to God. A journey of a thousand miles begins with the first step... just start walking!
