THE BETTY SMITH/HILLSIDE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Betty Smith Scholarship fund was established in June of 1992 to honor Betty Smith's long-time service as choir director. The purpose of the Betty Smith Scholarship fund is to promote higher education by offering financial assistance to graduating high school seniors.

APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as an applicant for the Betty Smith/Hillside United Methodist Church Scholarship, one must

- 1. be an active member of Hillside United Methodist Church for one year prior to graduation. Active participation is defined as being involved on a **regular** basis in at least one of the following activities:
 - Sunday morning worship
 - Sunday School class
 - Youth fellowship
 - A civic group sponsored by Hillside (i.e. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts)
 - Other (If you believe there is another area that would qualify your involvement other than the above mentioned, please list it.)
- 2. plan to continue his/her education after high school at either a 4-year or 2-year university/college or at a vocational school.
- 3. strive to exemplify a Christian life that reflects a Christ-like lifestyle at school, home, work, and at one's future institution of higher learning.
- 4. write an essay in answer to the following: Share your involvement with Hillside United Methodist Church. Are there particular experiences or special memories that you would like to share? Your essay should follow all formal conventions for writing: content, organization, and mechanics will all be considered in evaluating the essay.
- Put your essay and application in a sealed envelope and drop it off in the Hillside Church office by <u>March 31, 2018.</u> Please indicate "Scholarship Committee" on the outside of the envelope.

Hillside will offer Safe Sitter® classes to students in the community in grades 6-8 to prepare students to be safe when they are alone watching younger siblings or babysitting. Students will learn



life-saving skills such as how to rescue someone who is choking and helpful information like what to do if there is severe weather. The lessons are filled with fun activities and role-playing exercises. Students even get to use manikins to practice choking rescue. A PARENT'S GUIDE TO HOLY WEEK

Do you ever struggle to find the right words to help your child understand what's happening in "big church"? We're here to help! In fact, we believe that kids can understand much more than when we give them credit for, and when we skip the parts of Jesus' story that aren't as pretty or don't feel so good, they get an incomplete story of God's love and Jesus' sacrifice for each of us. Use this guide to help you and your children understand what we celebrate during Holy Week.

Holy Week

This is the week before Easter Sunday. During this week, we remember Jesus' last days with his friends, the disciples, in Jerusalem. We also retell the stories of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Palm Sunday

One week before Easter, we remember the last time that Jesus traveled to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover, a festival that happened every year since Old Testament times. Crowds of people were excited to see Jesus and waved palms in his honor. They believed he was coming to be their king and rule the country.

Maundy Thursday

Some people call this The Last Supper. This is the day we remember Jesus' final meal with his friends. He knew he wouldn't see them again, so he shared everything he wanted them to know. He told them that the most important thing is to love others as he loved them and he modeled serving by washing their feet. We take communion on Maundy Thursday because this is when Jesus instructed his friends to remember him each time they broke bread and drank wine.

Good Friday

This is the day when Jesus was hung on a cross and died. Although this makes us feel sad, we remember that Jesus willingly gave his life so that we would be free from sin. He allowed himself to be captured, tried, and crucified so he could take the punishment for our sin. Jesus died for the good of our souls because He loves us that much. Good Friday services are often quiet and somber.

Duties would be putting a menu together, purchasing groceries, then fixing the meal. Monday of the meal get deliveries ready for the people who will be delivering.


CARING FOR KIDS

Little Lambs is where the foundation of faith begins for the smallest among us in the Nursery and Toddler Room. In March in the toddler room, we will be doing a new unit: *Donkey and the King*. Through the story, song, and play, we will be learning the many ways we can praise God with our voice to sing, our hands to raise high, and our feet that take us anywhere to praise Him. Our bible verse is *Psalm 100:2 Worship the Lord with gladness, come before Him, singing with joy*.

In the Nursery, we will be exploring sound with musical instruments. Children learn best through their senses, which engages discovery and wonder.

Nursery and Toddler Room are a safe place for children to explore and learn. As we are in the height still of flu season, please keep in mind the following guidelines that we follow for the protection of your child and other children. Please do not bring your child if he or she is having any health issues such as fever, current or within previous 24 hours, contagious infections (flu, strep, pink eye, Staph), vomiting or diarrhea, significant persistent nasal drainage green or yellow in color, any skin infection or unexplained rash, cough, common cold, or unusual or unexplained loss of appetite.

Little Lambs will be available during Holy week services: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter during both 8:30 and 10:45 services. We begin check-in for children 15 minutes before service time.
