"WHY WE GIVE" | BISHOP MIKE COYNER (CONTINUED)

We give when we see needs and want to help. This is where all of those appeals are effective – we look over the requests and appeals that we receive, and when we see a need we can help, then we give to it.

Now, I have to confess that for many years as a pastor I worked hard to get people to give for the wrong reasons. I appealed for support of our church budget. I asked people to give to grow our ministries. I probably even used a little bit of guilt to encourage people to give, rather than allowing them to be selfish. Most of the time that worked – I did fund-raising for the churches and ministries I served, and it was effective because people saw the value in those churches and ministries.

But eventually I began to mature in my own giving and in my understanding of stewardship. I began to ask people to give out of gratitude to God and as a witness to their faith. And that freed me from any sense of being a "salesman" for our church to being one who proclaimed the spiritual truth about stewardship. I moved from fund-raising to stewardship-proclaiming. I focused less upon the need to balance our church budget, and more upon the need to balance our lifestyles. And the results were even more effective in terms of dollars but also in terms of joyful satisfaction.

You are welcome to give for almost any good reason. Whatever appeals to you is great, because I believe that any person of faith must be a giver. That's the secret to living – it is all about giving. And it is all about gratitude to God.

So, please give.



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"WHY WE GIVE" | BISHOP MIKE COYNER

This is the season of stewardship and pledge drives and other financial efforts in many of our churches and institutions. Every day it seems our mailbox is filled with appeals from groups and ministries and missions requesting that we give to support their good work. All of that is good and helpful, but most of their requests do not speak to the reason why my wife, Marsha, and I give. So perhaps this list of "why we give" might be helpful to others who are contemplating their giving for the rest of 2014 and into 2015.

- 1. We give out of gratitude to God. We are not really that motivated by giving to institutions (although we do) or by giving to special needs (although we do) or by giving to missional efforts (although we do). No, our primary motivation for giving is to express our gratitude to God. We believe that everything we have is a gift from God, so we give because we are grateful.
- 2. We tithe as a witness to our faith. We tithe to the church where Marsha has her membership (we bishops do not have membership in a local church or even in an Annual Conference, we are members of the Council of Bishops), and then we give additional to each church where we visit or I preach, and finally we give to support various appeals and mission efforts. Our primary giving is our tithe, because we believe that tithing is obedience to God and a witness to our faith in God.
- 3. We give because we believe that the secret to living is giving. Giving is what life is about giving our love, our prayers, our support, our material gifts, our efforts, etc. Life is meant to be lived, shared and generously multiplied. God has designed life in such a way that when try to hold onto life, we lose it but when we give life away, we receive life in more abundance.
- 4. We give because it is fun, and joyful, and fulfilling. There is nothing quite like giving to someone or to some cause and seeing the joy that our gifts can create. That is most obvious when we give to our children and grand-children, but it is true in other situations, too. Giving is fun. I know that might sound a little selfish, but it is true. We give because we enjoy it.

During her main stage talk, she said, "The best way to help our kids to God's story is through the gift of ritual," and she's not just talking about the rituals we engage in during a Sunday service, but also the rituals we can engage in at home to share our faith with our children and grandchildren.

This Advent season I want to help you engage in ritual in your own home as we eagerly await the arrival of our savior Jesus Christ. On Sunday, November 30, the first Sunday of Advent, the children and I will be making Advent wreaths during children's church. Each Sunday of Advent, you'll find a devotional in the bulletin to use as you light your own Advent wreath at home, as well as discussion points to help the children in your life understand the significance behind the ritual.

My prayer is that you will feel God's presence and power as you worship together in your home, sharing in faith as a family.

Changes for the choir! If you have been to the 8:30 service this fall, you already know that the choir is singing from a different location. We have moved down from the stage to the floor of the worship center and have been tweaking this arrangement to make it as comfortable as possible for everyone. We know that change is hard—for everybody! But this change for the choir means that for the first time in 12 years, we will be able to fully participate in worship. For 12 years, we have heard our pastors from behind them, not being able to see their faces as they ministered to the congregation. We had not been able to participate in Holy Communion with the fellowship of the church congregants—we have had to have our communion separately from the rest of you. For 12 years, we have not easily been able to (or not able to at all) participate in the passing of the peace, to kneel at the prayer kneelers, to light candles at the candle tables, or to make use of the prayer wall, among other things. Usually, we are not able to see the children during children's moments, and we are isolated from our families during the entire worship service. Change is hard for everyone, but we wanted you to know what this particular change means to us, and we are praying for your understanding and support of what we are doing. It's just really important for everyone to be able to fully participate as part of the Body of Christ in worship and all its elements.

An invitation! We are always open to new choir members! As we get older, have sick spells, move away, empty spaces are created. Please be open to sharing your talent of the love of music and singing with us. We are a fully volunteer group and do not hold auditions!! (Can you imagine the early Christians holding auditions to sing praises to their Savior????) You do not need to read music—we will teach you what you need to know!
