THE STRUGGLE IS REAL! Pastor Chris

Like most of you "normal people," pastors have their struggles... we have our ups and downs. Balancing work, family, home, play, finances, budgets, etc. is as hard for pastors as it is for everyone else. Perhaps there is a misconception – pastors are supposed to have it all together because they are supposed to be closer to God. Can I let you in on a little secret? There are times that we don't feel that close to God... and yet we still have to be "on" and lead anyway. The struggle is real!

I hope that it doesn't burst your bubble, or lessen your picture of me, but there are days that I wrestle with my faith and I wonder why God ever called me to be a pastor. Why me? I don't have it all together and even sometimes when I do feel like I've finally almost got it all together, I forget where I put it. There are days I pat myself on the back and say, "Good job, Chris!" And, there are others that I kick myself in the pants and say, "You really messed that up!" There are days that I think I could qualify for the "parent of the year award" and other days that I'm left wondering if I have scarred my kids for life... I ask myself, "Why couldn't you just smile and keep your big mouth shut?" Sometimes I am certain that I am the "world's greatest husband" and other times I fail miserably! All of these ups and downs can happen in the same week and sometimes even in the same day. The struggle is real!

I find myself wondering how can I preach, lead, love, and serve this church effectively and efficiently while at the same time wrestling with all my internal junk too? My prayer is often that God moves and God works in spite of this pastor. I often hang up from an important phone call wondering if I said too much or not enough, or did I say the wrong thing altogether? I have given my life in service to Christ and yet, like many of you, I still struggle with my shortcomings wondering if God will really make up the difference where I fall short.

The only way that I know to "recalibrate," "refocus," "renew," and deal with my junk is to take time away here or there... to checkout and detach myself from my normal routine to spend time alone with my wife or invest in some quality family time. Sometimes I come back "refreshed" and other times I return overwhelmed by all the work that piled up while I was away.

It is during my moments, or seasons, of insecurity that God reminds me that I am valuable because I am his child and God loves me because of who He is and not because of what I do or how I perform. Maybe you need that reminder too? If you haven't taken time for yourself or time with your family lately, maybe a break is long past due?

One of the things I love most about the local church is that when we get it right, we provide a place where all of us imperfect people can gather in the midst of our struggles. As your pastor, I covet your patience and forgiveness when I fall short or when I get it completely wrong. I covet your prayers as I attempt to be faithful to the One who called me. As we begin this season of thanksgiving, I am thankful for your love, support and compassion. I am thankful for a church that welcomes broken people like me.
