FROM YOUR PASTOR—Pastor Chris Neikirk

The way God designed our bodies is a model for understanding our lives together as a church: every part dependent on every other part, the parts we mention and the parts we don't, the parts we see and the parts we don't. If one part hurts, every other part is involved in the hurt, and in the healing. If one part flourishes, every other part enters into the exuberance. You are Christ's body—that's who you are! You must never forget this. Only as you accept your part of that body does your "part" mean

anything. You're familiar with some of the parts that God has formed in his church, which is his "body": apostles, prophets, teachers, miracle workers, healers, helpers, organizers, those who pray in tongues.

1 Corinthians 12:25-31, The Message

APPLE PIES!

The 2013 Apple Pie Project is over. A big thank you to all that helped with the preparation in all the areas, purchased supplies, bought the pies, worked in the stand, prayers, and the staff that helped in the background (providing all the behind the scenes support). We had a very successful year. We made 1150 pies; 270 prebaked and 880 baked. We had 50 pies left and have already sold more than 20 of them. We have them in the freezer at church if you would like to buy another one.

On the right is a breakdown of the total cost of making these pies if we had to purchase everything.

We had \$1693 in cash donations and as of today we have \$10,251.85 deposited from sales. The total profit will not be finalized for a couple more weeks as we are still turning in receipts for reimbursements.
