

Our work force is dwindling each year and with the potential younger volunteers working jobs during the day we have decided to make less pies next year. Money made from the sales will be used where needed this year. Our initial count \$8886 receipts and \$2590 expense. This profit would not be possible without the generous donations of ingredients and cash.

#### **CHILDREN AND YOUTH DISCIPLESHIP PATH**

Through the generosity of the Center for Congregations Youth Ministry Grant Initiative and the hard work of children and youth leaders, Hillside UMC now has a discipleship path in place for toddlers through high school seniors who participate in our Sunday and Wednesday programming. With the help of Ministry Architects Consultant Stephanie Caro, your family ministry team developed seven core competencies with corresponding themes and lesson topics that we believe are essential to helping children and youth develop an active faith that will carry with them through adulthood.

This means that every curriculum, lesson, and activity will be connected to at least one of these core competencies, ideas that we want to ensure our kids confidently know and can apply:

- I am Made to Serve

- I Have a Purpose in God's Plan
  - I Know the Bible
- I Can Count on Church Family

In January, we will begin developing a 3-year scope and sequence that will ensure all competencies, themes, and lessons are met.

Our next step in the process is to develop a rites of passage or milestones system. It is important that we honor significant stages of each child's life, not just within our programming but also as a congregation. We want to celebrate with our families not only baptisms and graduations, but also things like losing a first tooth and getting a driver's license.
