FROM YOUR PASTOR | CHRIS NEIKIRK

As September approaches, I am anxious... for a number of reasons. I am anxious because my treatment for cancer will most likely be complete and I will have my first CT Scan since beginning treatment - we're praying for an "all clear!" I am anxious to begin the healing process and look forward to my life returning to normal... whatever normal is. I am anxious to resume my responsibilities of making hospital visits, spending time with our nursing home residents, and officiating funerals because I consider it a joy and a privilege to walk through difficult moments in life with God's people. Lastly, I am anxious to begin our Fall Sermon Series; September will focus on Restoration and October's title is "Live to Give."

September is a month of change for many reasons: the weather shifts toward fall, first week(s) jitters of back to school subside, fall sports are in full swing, we resume our midweek activities at Hillside, and most of us have settled into our school-year routines. Research shows that September is a month during which people in general are open to trying new things: exercise, hobbies, activities, and even church. This excites me because our September Series, Restoration, will focus on God doing a new thing in our hearts and restoring us back to people who more closely resemble the image of God.

A few facts for your consideration as September approaches: about 80% of adults in the Midwest would consider themselves to be Christian - meaning they believe in God. That's good news. However, the percentage of "unchurched" adults has risen over the last 20 years to almost 40%. What does that mean? Almost one out of every two people that you encounter on a daily basis has not attended a religious establishment, besides a wedding or a funeral, in the last six months. When asked, the number one reason people give church a try is because someone they know invited them. What does that mean for Hillside? Almost half of our community does not have a church home, yet would visit Hillside if we would only be so bold as to ask.

September's messages will focus on hope and healing and restoration. People are open to trying new things and half of our community does not have a church home! BE BOLD CHURCH and reach out to people in your world. I'm excited to begin my physical healing, but I am even more excited to see what God does at and through Hillside in the coming months!



A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FAMILY MINISTRIES

Although it is 88 degrees outside and the humidity feels like a wet blanket thrown across my face as I write this, the calendar tells me that fall is approaching. Although we don't typically associate the fall with growth, I predict a real surge at Hillside. New visitors walk though our doors every week, and individuals in the congregation are reaching out to the community with invitations to attend. And let's not forget about our amazing Hillside kids! They are excited about all they're learning here and they're talking to their friends about it.

If you've looked at the church calendar recently, you've likely noticed that the fall months are packed full with activities for all age groups, from Wednesday night meals to book studies to festivals. Within those activities, you'll find a true effort to incorporate family, to create space for families to share a meal, to worship, and to have fun together. I am praying for a group of 5 - 6 people who desire to learn more about God's blueprint for discipleship within the family, and who will then share and inspire our congregation.
