#### HILLSIDE LITTLE LAMBS

Hillside Little Lambs is where the foundation of faith begins for the smallest among us in the Nursery and Toddler Room. In August in the toddler room, we started the unit *The Dreamer*. This unit will continue until the middle of September. We are learning about Joseph and his coat of many colors and how God had plans for Joseph. Our bible verse is *Jeremiah 29:11* "*I know the plans I have for you" says the Lord.* "*They are plans for good".* Through story, song, play, crafts, and fun snacks we have learned about Joseph and how God has big plans for us too. The children have so much fun when a favorite song is played. During story time about Joseph they can relate to him in sharing that also have brothers, and even tried a new snack where we used graham crackers, icing, and sprinkles to make Joseph's coat! We have made a craft together that is on display by the nursery and tod-dler room. I hope you stop by to check it out!

In the Nursery, we have been discovering animals with lots of stuffed animals of different sizes and textures. Children learn best through their senses, which engages discovery and wonder. Nursery and Toddler Room are a safe place for children to explore and learn.

We have had several 1st time visits in the nursery in the past month, which means there are lots of little ones adjusting to the space, getting familiar with the people and sounds, and most of all being away from their parents. That is why our volunteers serve on a 6-weeks basis to be a familiar face which helps the babies and toddlers to feel secure and safe.

Little Lambs is available during both 8:30 and 10:45 a.m. services each Sunday and also during Sunday School hour at 9:45 a.m. Starting September 12, our Wednesday night programming will start 6:00-7:30 p.m. We will begin learning about Joseph through, *Dreams Come True.* We begin check-in for children 15 minutes before service and programming time. Each month, we can give you the same people to deliver so that you can become familiar with that person and your route of deliveries.

You might recall the Sermon on the Mount. It is a call to spirituality and lessons on God's way of judging matters. Jesus tells us, Paul reminds us, that there is the letter of the Law and the Spirit of the Law. The men accusing the woman thought they had the woman condemned and Jesus trapped. They stood there in their sanctimonial pharisaical and hypocritical piety demanding Jesus to "drop the hammer" on this ill-fated woman while entrapping Jesus. In response to their demand Jesus gave them their answer by the Letter and Spirit of the Law: "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her."

Jesus was writing in the dirt. Unfortunately, we do not know what he was writing. We do know whatever he was writing the woman's accusers knew what it was. Perhaps it was a teaching from the Sermon on the Mount when Jesus said: "But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart (Mt 5:28)." The Law of Moses required the accusers (when death is the penalty) to be the, "first to throw a stone," in judgment (DE 17:6-7). Perhaps Jesus was reminding them of their past secret indiscretions?

That teaching by Jesus is a game changer—whether someone witnessed our transgression or not we stand accused by our own heart! Our heart testifies against us! St. John wrote: "for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything" (1Jo 3:20). How many times have you gotten away with doing something wrong? Your mom or dad, siblings, spouse, friend, co-worker, police and so on may not know what you did but your heart knows, and God knows. The remedy for our heartache is simple: "If we confess our sins [to Jesus], he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1Jo 1: 9)." It appears that "No One" is getting away with anything.

#### **FROM PASTOR CURTIS**

Driving in Princeton the other day I ran a stop sign! Being a newcomer and not knowing the streets one could say it was understandable. Who knows how long that stop sign has been there, a silent sentinel directing traffic at this busy intersection? Startled by my traffic infraction I thought, I just ran a stop sign! I was thankful no one was coming hence no accident—which would have been my fault. Most thankfully, I was delighted no police witnessed my transgression—hence no ticket!

Many of you may recall the story of the woman caught in the act of adultery. I need not go into all the verbiage of what this meant. Needless to say she must have felt humiliated being caught in such a compromising condition. Her accusers forcibly ushered her to Jesus and publicized her transgression: "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. Now in the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women (LE 20:10). So what do you say (John 8:4-5)?"

Knowing that I transgressed a traffic law I could locate the nearest police officer and turn myself in. However, it would seem to me that the officer would say they hadn't witness the transgression hence no ticket, no fine and no traffic record. I would be told to enjoy the freebie! As I continued on my travels I thought, I got away with that one! I told myself to be more diligent and assured myself that I would ever be on the lookout for stop signs that pop up suddenly out of nowhere.

The woman caught in the act of adultery was in a fix: publicly accused, publicly humiliated, and publicly condemned. Would she be killed by the mob for her transgression? The woman's accusers thought they had Jesus behind the 8-ball! They appointed themselves prosecutor and judge and expected Jesus to be the executioner. The woman transgressed the Law (you will not commit adultery EX 20:14), the penalty is cut and dry (death LE 20:10), what are you waiting for Jesus?

I concluded there was no point in me locating the nearest police officer and confessing my offence. The officer might ask me where I reside, take note of what I looked like, write down the description of my vehicle and be on the lookout for me while on patrol. Next time I might not be as fortunate. I best be still. I got away with it—or did I?

School is back in session and this means it is time for 2 Fish 5 Loaves (backpack program) to begin. 2 Fish 5 Loaves is a mission program that fills weekend food bags for Kindergarten to 5<sup>th</sup> grade students at North Gibson School. To kick off the school year, we are going to have a backpack filling party on Sunday, Sept. 16 during the 8:30 and 10:45 a.m. service. If you would like to help with this program, a team of volunteers fill bags every Sunday after the 10:45 a.m. service. August was the one year anniversary when Hillside became a certified Safe Sitter® teaching site. In the last year, we have held 2 classes putting 12 students in the





The lessons are filled with fun activities and role-playing exercises. They get to use manikins to practice choking rescue. Students who attend Hillside will then have the opportunity to serve in Hillside Little Lambs upon completion of the Safe Sitter® course. I am aware people often get tired of hearing about giving. Hopefully you are not one of them—as you see the spiritual and everyday blessing of contributing to something

bigger than yourself. You also know that Jesus said it is more blessed to give than receive. We are a blessed people and if you want a blessing you cannot contain becoming a cheerful giver. How about starting soon? As your pastor I covenant with you to give extra (beyond my regular giving) to help retire this debt. I have already given a sizable contribution to retire this debt. 

There are very few sounds as engaging and life-giving as children laughing, and with the return of Family Builders and our children's programming on Wednesdays this month, this building is soon to be full of life. #### A WORD FROM AMY EVANS

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Galatians 5:13-14.
